Tizz Crowley, from Auburn, brings to life the wife of Dr. Oren Horr, who served as the assistant surgeon for the USCT #114. Dr. Elizabeth Kingman Horr was a nurse during the Civil War and observed the medical conditions and the sufferings of the soldiers during the Civil War. She was also one of the earliest women physician in Maine.

Tizz Crowley, spends most of her time "living" in the 1860's as she spends months traveling to various Civil War era related events all over country. She also recently was accepted as a member of the Florida Authentic Civil Towne (FACT).
